

# Quiet Hour at The Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace

The Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace is a museum in Savannah, Georgia.

The museum is in the house where Juliette Gordon Low was born. She started Girl Scouts.

People who are Girl Scouts and people who are not Girl Scouts enjoy visiting this house and hearing her story.

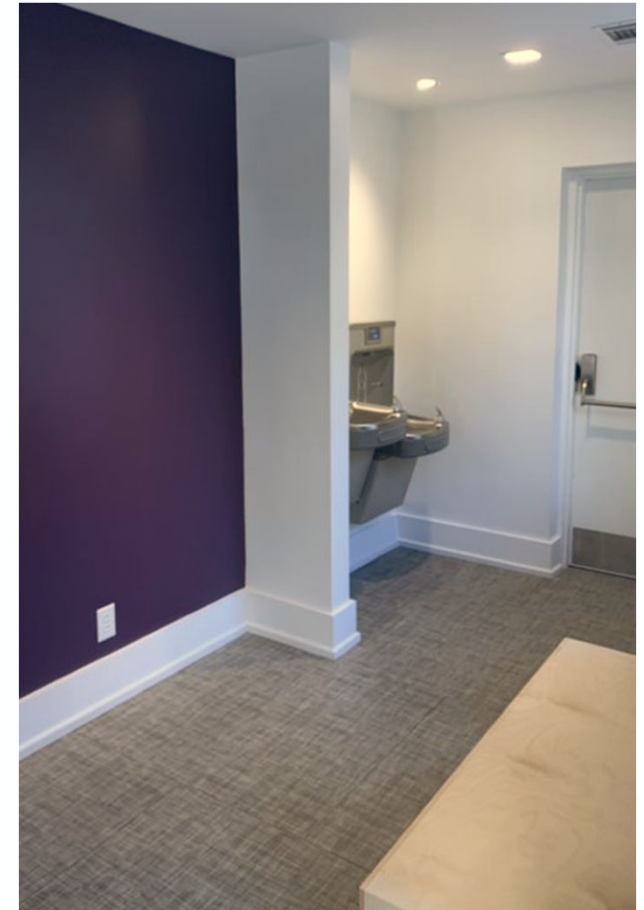
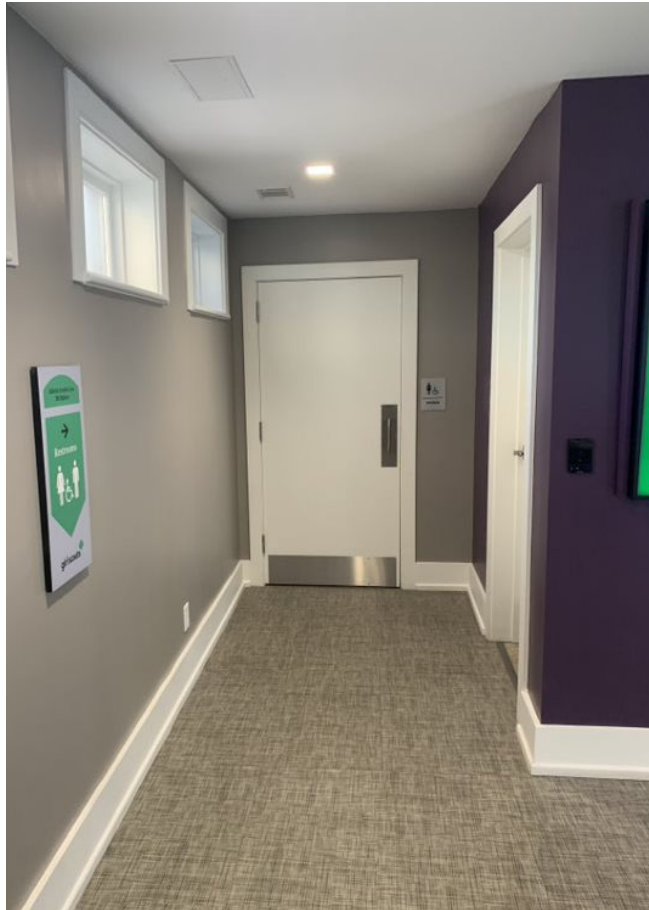
It is a sticker that you wear while you visit. It says "QH" for Quiet Hour.

A museum guide will give you a booklet.

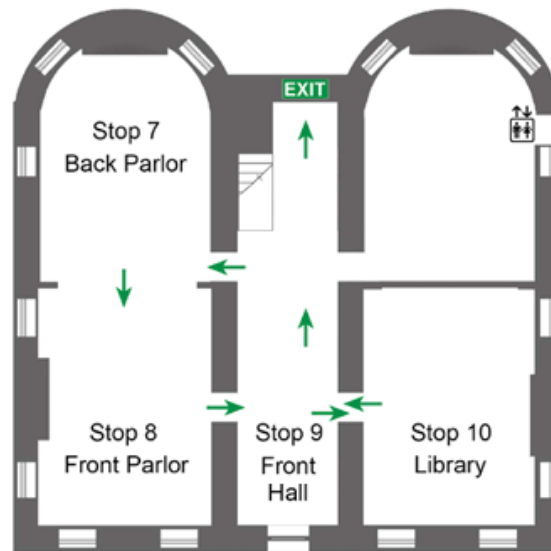
It has a map you can use to explore the museum, like the one you see here.

It has a *Nature I Spy* activity you can try at the museum.

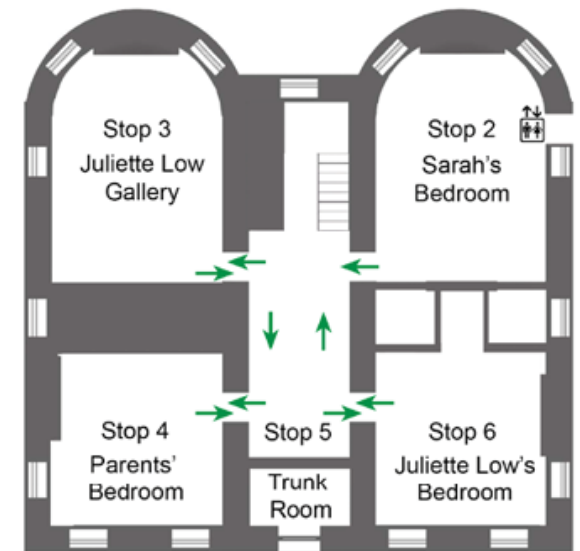
It also shows the museum guidelines.

# Guidelines

- ❑ People will use their inside voices while they visit.
- ❑ People may look at but not touch the art and furniture in the house.
- ❑ People may not eat, drink, or chew gum in the upstairs rooms of the house.
- ❑ People may take photos without flash but may not take videos in the house.

There are some things in the house that you may touch:

- the stair rail if you use the stairs
- gray plastic chairs if you need to sit
- books and activities in the library room

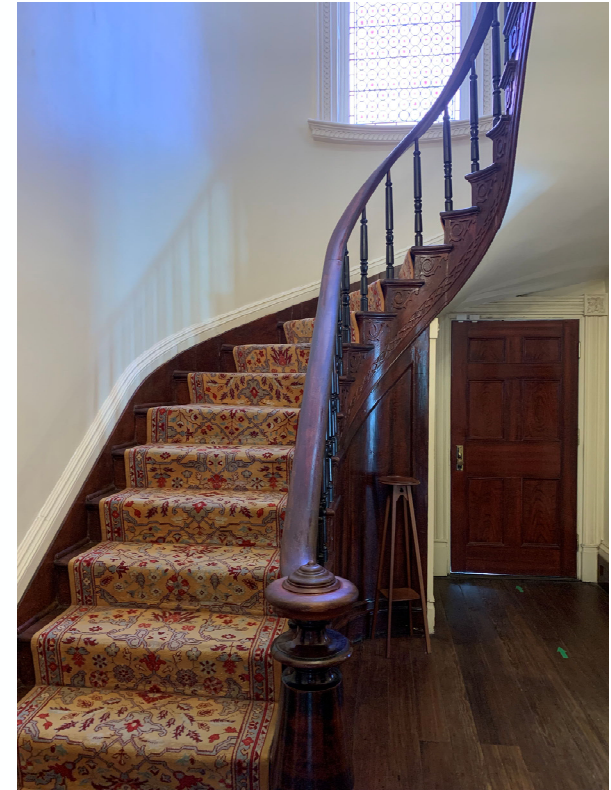
Museum guides can tell you what things you may touch.

If you do not want to use the elevator, you can use the stairs. A museum guide will show you where to go.

You can choose to visit the museum store before you leave.

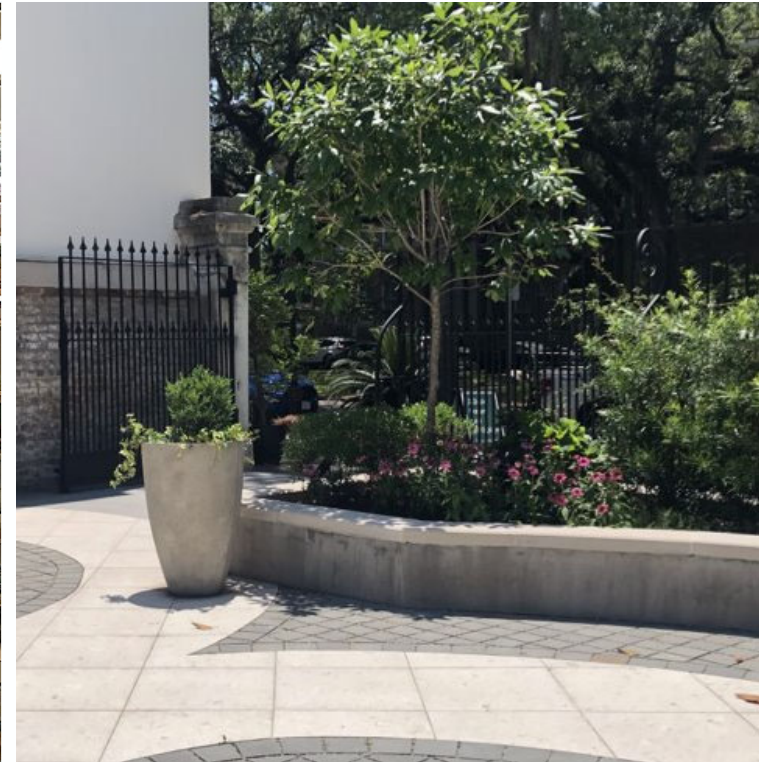
The friendly staff are happy to help you!
