Collection Highlight



This miniature portrait of William Washington Gordon II was painted around 1875 and is in the south parlor of the Birthplace. In this portrait, William Washington Gordon II is wearing a double-breasted coat, white

collar, and cravat. Miniature portraits came about in European Royal Courts in the 1500s and grew in popularity during Queen Elizabeth I's reign. They were then introduced to colonial America by English settlers. Miniature portraits were often used as gifts, symbols of love, or keepsakes to remember a loved one after their death. Originally, artists would create miniature portraits using watercolor on vellum, a fine parchment originally made from the skin of a calf. The portrait would be attached to a card, usually a playing card, with a starch paste. Since then, artists have used different materials for miniature portraits, including plumbago, ivory, and enamel. Miniature portraits remained popular until photography became increasingly accessible and sought-after, turning miniature portraits into lost art.
