Six Nature Paintings by William Mussill (1906)

William Mussill was an Austrian-born painter, known for his depictions of birds, plants, and insects. His work for the Minton ceramic factory is widely admired and collected today. The paintings depict a green and red quetzal (the national bird of Guatemala), a bird of paradise from New Guinea with cascading white feathers, magnolia blossoms, peaches and strawberries, a blue butterfly among red azaleas, and green-red grapes with a bee. These paintings belonged to Juliette Gordon Low, who loved birds and nature and also painted on china.

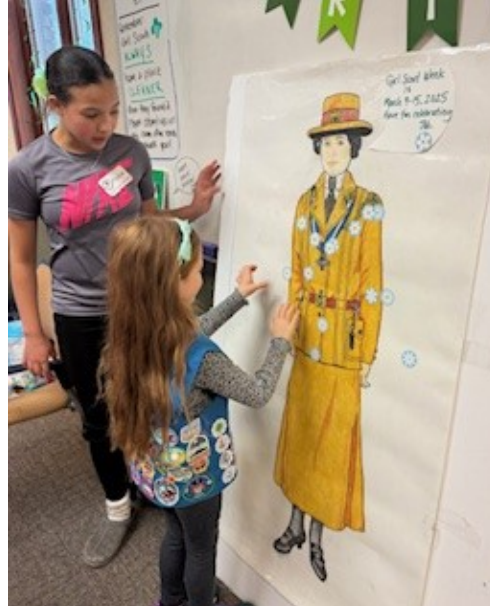
Girl Scouts of Colorado hosted a program at the Denver Mint on March 24th with their History Committee and Margot Iwanchuk.
