This photograph shows a Girl Scout picking squash at Camp Andrée Clark in Briarcliff, NY. "During the summer (of 1942), 2,339 Girl Scouts worked a total of 48,068 hours on farms under the Farm Aide Program. They weed and cultivate farmland, spray and pick crops, feed livestock and repair small tools." (*Highlights in Girl Scouting, 1912-2001*, p 18)
