The Birthplace is dedicated to preserving the legacy of Juliette Gordon Low, founder of the Girl Scouts of the USA and a significant figure in women's history. Built in 1821, this historic mansion marks the beginning of Juliette's transformative journey. Visitors can experience guided tours and exhibits that provide insights into her fascinating life story and America's Progressive Era. Recognized as Savannah's first National Historic Landmark, our site reflects both the city's rich history and Juliette Gordon Low's enduring impact on expanding opportunities for girls and women worldwide.



Accessibility

The Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace Museum is the only house museum in Savannah with full elevator accessibility. Our site offers street-level entrances and automated door entries. A wheelchair is available upon request. The Birthplace can provide American Sign Language interpreters with two weeks' notice. Sensory accommodations, including social stories and a quiet room, are available. Accessible restrooms can be found throughout the site.

Parking


A tour bus loading area is located on Bull Street, in front of our gift shop entrance. No on-site parking is available; metered street parking and nearby parking garages are recommended.

Timing

Plan to spend at least an hour and a half to fully enjoy the tour, garden, and museum store. Tours last 45 minutes to an hour. Larger groups should allot more time on-site, especially if their visit includes multiple tour slots.

Guided Tours

A tour of the Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace offers an exciting glimpse into our founder's journey and the origins of the Girl Scout Movement, which has empowered girls for over 100 years. Seven spacious rooms with original and period furnishings set the scene in early 20th-century America. You'll see unique architectural features like carved millwork, decorative plaster ceilings, and a curved mahogany staircase. Numerous artworks, including pieces by Juliette herself, are displayed throughout the house.



Booking

For group tours of 10 or more, contact our Tours Manager at birthplace@girlscouts.org. A deposit of 50% is due 60 days prior to the visit, and the total balance is due 5 days prior. For groups of fewer than 10, visit our website to book your tour.

Cancellations

We offer a 100% refund for cancellation requests made 30 days prior and a 50% refund for requests made 14 days prior. There are no refunds for requests made within 13 days or less of the visit.

Group Size

Tours accommodate a maximum of 16 people. More than 16 requires multiple slots. Large groups are asked to arrive 15 minutes early to unload, divide their party, and handle restroom needs.
